Pandamania at VBS!

For the last three years Betsey Grover and Nancy Monahan have represented Trinity at the West Ohio Annual Conference held at Lakeside, Ohio. This year Karen Brantley also represented Trinity. We have three ministers so we can send three delegates.

Conference is a learning experience and met this year from June 6-9, 2011. There are basically four divisions: worship services with guest speakers, Bishop Ough's sermons, workshops, and corporate and business sessions which consume most of the long days.

This year's theme was on evangelism. The United Methodist Church is losing members in the United States. Our denomination is not having enough people join on profession of faith. In Vietnam, by contrast, Methodism is growing by giant leaps, as it is in Africa and other places globally.

The three guest speakers had very different styles of presentation. Rev. Vance Ross spoke on "New Life Unleashed." He stressed that people are dormant in religious understanding. In his dynamic way, he said we need to get out of the church, meet people, invite them into the church, and be prepared to get them involved.

Martha Grace Reese's sermon was titled "Unbinding the Gospel." (She is the niece of Trinity members Miles and Eleanor Durfey.) She spoke about evangelism from her experience as a consultant, researcher and systemic analyst for congregational and denominational leaders. She said that research reveals common themes among healthy churches: 1) openly loving Jesus through prayer, 2) sharing their faith and lives through God stories, 3) and focusing active involvement outside their own walls.

Terry Teykl's sermon dealt with the "Presence-Based Church" and the power of prayer. We must pray for our churches and for the people we can help find faith.

The corporate and business sessions composed most of the time and included reports from various United Methodist activities in the West Ohio Conference. One very interesting outreach is the Charitable Pharmacy at Livingston Ave UMC (where Rev. Brooks was pastor from 1981-1987). The UM Children's Home is now an outpatient facility treating youngsters and their families. Wesley Glen was given high marks.

Eleven Recommendations were presented. Two were defeated. Every delegate has an opportunity for voice and vote to the assembly which numbers over 2,000 people.

The other major business was to elect 52 delegates to General and Jurisdictional Conferences. This was a very difficult task and required numerous written ballots.

Workshops were offered to gain more knowledge and insight into the Conference theme of Unleashing New Life -New places, New people, Renewed churches.

Bishop Ough's Episcopal address is always inspiring with his quick wit and devotion to Methodism. He had the interns introduced and he confirmed the pastoral appointments as well the commissioning of clergy.

Trinity Member Karen Brantley was introduced as the newly appointed Hispanic/Latino Ministry Coordinator for the Central Ohio Capitol Area North and South District. Annual Conference was a rewarding experience for all representatives.

## Disciple I and Disciple III Bible Studies begin in September

### **Disciple I: Becoming Disciples through Bible Study**

emphasizes a disciplined reading of and listening to Scripture. During the course, participants read more than 70% of the Bible. Each participant commits to about 30 minutes of daily preparation as well as to attending all weekly classes. The results are transformational, as Disciple Bible Study calls persons to submit themselves to examination by Scripture, to put themselves under the power of God's word, and to be changed by it.

Alison Poor writes about her recent Disciple I experience: *In reading over 70% of the Bible, I realized how differently each of the people in the Bible experienced God and how their relationships with Him were always unique. As a result, I now feel more secure in how I experience my faith and about the relationship I have with God. I also gained a deeper understanding of Jesus' message of love and how that extends to me and to everyone in the world.*

Disciple I will run Thursdays September 15 - May 17 from 9-11 a.m. in Trinity's Room 207. Sign-ups are August 21-September 11th. If needed, childcare can be provided. Rev. **DISCIPLE III: Remember Who You Are** is aimed at developing strong Christian leaders. Its purpose may be expressed in the words of Ephesians 4:12: "to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ." The driving idea in this study is the connection between memory and identity as the people of God. The word You in the title is meant to be heard both in its singular form (the individual) and its plural form (the community). We are a community of memory.

Several themes weave their way through the study - the call to remember; the call to repentance; the need for renewed vision (eyes to see, ears to hear); and the place of community.

One of Trinity's clergy members was recently overheard saying, "In seminary we never read as deeply and as widely as we do in Disciple!" The gift of Disciple Study is a gift that continues being unwrapped throughout our lives as its influence resounds long after its four years of study have ended.

DISCIPLE III study will run Wednesdays from 11:30 a.m. - 1:30 p.m. September 14 through May 2. Sign-up sheets will be available in the Atrium August 21 - September 11. Child care will be provided as needed.

Dr. Carolyn Leick and Janet Goodwin are delighted to be leading Disciple III. All participants must have completed Disciple I. However, It is not necessary for participants in Disciple III to have completed Disciple II.

## Reverend Mark Dove returns to lead "Living the Questions"

Rev. Mark Dove, a retired United Methodist Minister, is returning to Trinity September 12 to complete the study, "Living the Questions." The class meets from 7 to 9 p.m. through October 17 in Rooms 208/209. All are welcome.

The two-hour sessions will provide an opportunity for in-depth discussion as we examine together the tough questions all of us have asked. The study is an open-minded alternative to those that attempt to give participants pat or simplistic answers. It creates an environment in which participants interact with one another as they explore the best of today's theological thought. At the same time, those in the discussion will strive together to explore what's next for Christianity. Some of today's leading religious voices will be heard.

## Adult Sunday School 2011/2012

While we are still enjoying the summer's lazy days, Adult Council is busy planning course offerings for the 2011-12 program year. The council hopes that everyone will consider attending an adult education offering from 10-11 Sunday mornings beginning September 11. As always, a variety of courses will be offered throughout the year, divided into five sessions of five to eight weeks each. The Adult Education Council has chosen to provide Sunday school classes each year that cover the following topics: Bible Study; Theology; Ethics; Social Concerns; Liturgical Arts; Christian Living; and The United Methodist Church.

Two professors from Trinity Lutheran Seminary on the campus of Capital University will be teaching sessions this year. Professor Rod Hutton will be teaching "Sin, Evil and the Devil" as well as a course about the Quran. Professor Paul Numrich will lead us in a study about Muslims in America. Other courses will be led by members of our Trinity family. Chris Scott will lead a class on Civility in Public Discourse around the time of the 2012 election, Matt Hamilton will continue his class, "In His Word," and a year-long class on Christian Families will be offered alongside many others, filling rooms at Trinity every Sunday at 10 a.m. Rev. Mark Dove will complete the study, "Living the Questions" in the Fall, and other evening classes and workshops are being planned in these quiet, restful Summer months. Watch for announcements in the September issue of *Trinity Times*. We look forward to growing spiritually with you! See you in class.

### A Note from Staff Parish Committee

Staff Parish is pleased to announce the approval and unanimous support of a one-month (August 31-September 30) study sabbatical for Rev. Amy Aspey. ## Mission Team Up-Date.....How Will You Serve?

### **YWCA Family Center**

The YWCA Family Center is a nationally recognized facility that provides meals, shelter and support to temporarily homeless families. Last year, the Central Ohio community provided meals to over 800 families including more than 1,500 children. The value of these meals was estimated to save the YWCA over \$180,000.

Trinity servants of all ages regularly give of their time, talents and treasures to support this ministry. For instance, Ricky and Benji Matter donate the proceeds of their annual summer lemonade stand to the Family Center. These funds help purchase the lemonade that is served to the families with their taco salad, bananas and cookies. Another quiet servant is Brett Doughty. Every month as the meal is cooked and served, Brett quickly washes all the dishes from the first serving for use at the second serving. It takes a lot of dishes to serve over 200 people!

You, too, can give of your time, talents and treasures by signing up to donate food, transport the food from Trinity to the Family Center, wash dishes, prepare and/or serve the food. If you don't have time to shop, but still want to participate we'll even purchase the food for you (please make checks payable to Trinity with YWCA in the memo line). 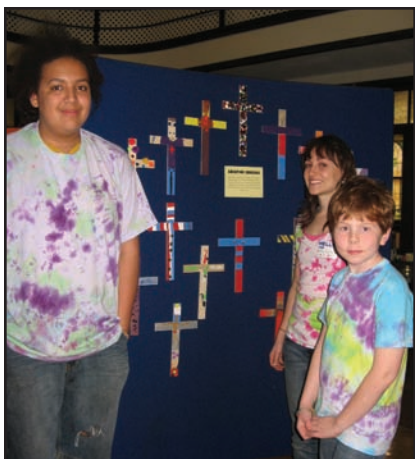

After two sessions it became clear that this program did not fit the interests of the New Life youth. I offered to teach art classes at New Life and this mentoring program became my Capstone focus. I was interested in determining if mentoring (through art) affected the self-esteem of underserved youth.

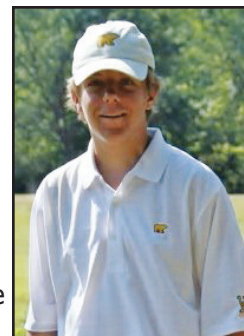
A generous grant from the Trinity Foundation allowed me to offset some of the cost for the art supplies. Knowing these children would not receive a hot meal until they returned to New Life for Sunday breakfast, my mom either provided dinner or recruited others to provide a meal. We had a variety of mentors join us on Fridays and each seemed equally moved by their experiences in serving our young neighbors. My favorite part of every dinner was the prayer, always offered by a child. They graciously thanked God and the mentors for coming into their lives.

The art program concluded with an Art Show on May 1st. Everyone wore self-made, tie-dyed shirts. The youth were coached to be hosts - welcoming guests, describing the art projects and serving lemonade and cookies. I enjoyed watching the children interact with our guests. I will continue to serve as a mentor at the Friday night program until the season concludes and look forward to participating in some small group trips over the summer. I have learned that mentoring requires significant energy, rapid-fire decision making, endless enthusiasm, and the strength to handle very tight and frequent hugs. I thank Rev. Aspey for serving as my Capstone mentor, leading me through the challenges and joys of serving others. Trinity supported this project in many ways and I will forever be grateful.
