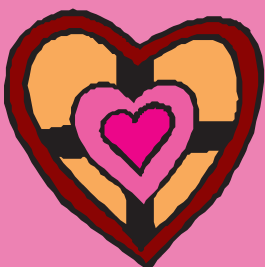

It is Well With My Soul

Media coverage of the recent earthquake in Haiti televised an interview of a young man still trapped under a collapsed concrete building. The reporter asked what he

was thinking and received a quiet reply, "As a Christian I know my life is in God's hands." Many may startle at such an answer, but the man's demeanor showed he was calm even facing possible sudden death. (He eventually was rescued but at the time of the interview, that was very uncertain.)

His witness served as a reminder that for people of genuine faith, nothing ultimately can defeat us because of our assurance that whatever happens, in the end everything will be OK. That "blessed assurance", as an old hymn states, brings "a foretaste of glory divine."

Horatio Spafford, author of another of our beloved hymns, knew that, too. He was a successful businessman in Chicago who had invested heavily in real estate along the shore of Lake Michigan. But the Chicago fire of 1871 destroyed much of his wealth. Sometime later, desiring an extended rest for his wife and four daughters, he booked passage for a trip to Great Britain in November 1873. Due to last minute business developments, he had to stay behind in Chicago.

With plans to travel soon, he sent his family on ahead. While at sea, on Nov. 22, 1873, their ship named the Ville du Havre was struck in a mid-ocean collision and sank in 12 minutes. Of the several hundred passengers and crew, only 57 were rescued. Four of the victims were the young daughters of Horatio and Anna Spafford. Their girls, ages 11, 9, 7, and 2 were lost in

the icy waters of the North Atlantic. Anna was pulled from the ocean dazed and delirious, clinging to a floating piece of the sunken ship.

When word reached Mr. Spafford by a telegram from his heart-broken wife, he rushed to book passage so he could join her. While on the open ocean, the captain called Mr. Spafford to the bridge and told him they were sailing near the place of the shipwreck. Spafford gazed silently at the water then left the bridge of the ship and returned to his cabin. He took pen and paper and wrote a magnificent poem of faith and trust because he knew this world is not all there is.

The Spaffords suffered other tragedies in their lives including the loss of a son to scarlet fever in the era before modern medicine. However, born out of tragedy came a deep desire to serve. They made their way to Jerusalem and eventually founded a children's hospital that now serves more than 30,000 children annually.

Out of this tragedy came one of the beloved hymns of Christendom. The tune is named after the ship that carried Spafford's family on that fateful night in 1873. Verses one and four sing:

*When peace like a river attendeth my way,
when sorrows like sea billows roll;
Whatever my lot, thou hast taught me to say,
"it is well, it is well, with my soul."*

*And, Lord, haste the day when my faith
shall be sight, the clouds be rolled back as a
scroll;
The trump shall resound, and the
Lord shall descend, even so, it is well with
my soul.*

Amid life's struggles and disappointments, let us never forget the witness of others who have overcome because of genuine faith. Whatever happens, "it is well with my soul."

Fellowship Hall cross dedicated in Stefanie Spielman's memory

A lasting tribute to Stefanie Spielman's life and faith came after her husband, Chris Spielman, gave the Crossroads Band an honorarium for playing at her celebration of life service.

Band members considered playing for Stefanie an incredible honor that was a reward in itself, and wanted to turn the gift into the seed for an appropriate tribute. They also wanted it to be a gift to the entire congregation.

After only a few minutes of discussion, the cross project was chosen as the right opportunity. Band members quickly organized a campaign to add to the initial honorarium and make the project possible.

The cross was built by John Packer, a master carpenter in Urbana. It is made of solid boards selected from a single oak tree. It is 10-feet tall and 5 and a half-feet wide. The base and cross weigh over 200 pounds.

The shell was donated by Fortin Ironworks. It is a handmade steel seashell crafted from a single piece of steel that weights almost 20 pounds itself. The shell was selected to reflect the design of the Trinity Sanctuary cross, while being totally unique and contemporary.

The cross was dedicated at Crossroads Worship on Sunday, December 20. The dedication plaque on the cross reads:

In Loving Memory of
Stefanie Spielman
who showed us all the
power of the cross
December 20, 2009

The simple cross that has stood near the stage for many years has not been abandoned. It was mounted high on the back wall of Fellowship Hall for the band, ministers and others to take inspiration from as they look back into the congregation.





Trinity Foundation provides many extras

The Trinity Foundation was quite active this past year and provided many extras for the church, its members, and the community. Have you ever wondered what happens with the contributions you make in honor or memory of a loved one? Foundation board members are proud to share with our church family the good works accomplished in 2009 with the gifts you have entrusted to us.

For many years, the Foundation has provided partial scholarships to church members who are pursuing seminary degrees. Last year, the Foundation continued this support and made a grant to a Trinity member who is working toward a Masters in Divinity at Methodist Theological School in Ohio.

When the school year ends, many churches around town quiet down to a slow schedule, but that is not the case here at Trinity. Our summer youth mission offerings are filled with energetic kids, so when the opportunity to hire not one - but two - of Trinity's college age members who wished to explore their potential call to ministry as Youth Ministry Interns, Trinity turned to the Foundation for help. The Foundation approved the grant to hire the young ladies who added a great deal to the youth programs. Additionally, Trinity was approved to participate in the Summer Ministry Intern Program through the West Ohio Conference and the Foundation provided the funds needed to secure an intern. This intern explored all aspects of the church and Trinity benefitted greatly from this placement.

Generations Council established a Grief Ministry program called the Grief Group this past spring which was very well received. In order to offer this same program in the fall, Generation Council asked the Foundation to provide the funding necessary to reach Trinity members who would benefit from this important ministry. The Foundation members were happy to oblige.

Trinity has an ongoing relationship with an orphanage in Mexico and provides mission opportunities for our members. The cost of mission trips can be a barrier for well intended potential volunteers, so when a Trinity member asked the Foundation for help with this obstacle, the Foundation approved their request.

Technology and worship music continue to play a larger role in our church services, especially the Contemporary Service, so when the current computer which runs the service needed to be replaced, the Foundation approved the grant brought forth by the Contemporary AV team. At the same time, an opportunity arose to make a music CD of our own Contemporary band, but start up costs were needed so the Foundation covered these costs. Once the CD is produced in 2010, it will be available to the public with proceeds going toward mission opportunities at Trinity.

As the new year starts, Trinity Foundation Board Members look forward to continuing our work of providing funding for worthy projects, programs and missions. We thank you for your ongoing support of the Trinity Foundation and appreciate the opportunity to serve the members of this wonderful church.
